PREVENTION AND CONTROL MEASURES AT SAMALAJU PORT

Action	Brief Description
Social distancing and workers' safety procedures	 The use of face masks by every employee/port user in the port area is mandatory Frequently wash hands using hand sanitizer or soap provided in the workplace Avoid 3C: Crowded places, Confined spaces and Close conversation Cancel unimportant meeting Implement the alternative communication methods (virtual meetings or online) Practice no handshake Avoid unnecessary outside work trips
Taking and record the body temperature of every worker and Port User	 Taking and record the body temperature of the employee/Port User at the main entrance and administrative building Employee/Port User with a body temperature 37.5 ° C and above is not allowed to enter the port and must be reported to his/her respective employer for further action
Distancing between worker/customer	 1-meter social distancing when lining up and dealing at the counter (Security Post and Administrative Building)
Contactless transaction	Encouraging the use of e-wallet/contactless payment (pay wave)
